Host Home Provider

Host Home Providers are NOT employees; they are independent contractors and manage their own home business. Being a Host Home Provider gives adults with unique challenges and needs an alternative to group homes or institutional placements. The concept is outcome oriented and focuses on building relationships in the community, the family, and one's personal life. Host Home Providers are free to do business with other agencies as long as no more than two people in services reside in the home. Host Home Providers work with adults with developmental disabilities providing community based supports. Responsibilities may include teaching independent living skills to maintain a clean and safe living environment, meal preparation and self-administration of medication. Transporting individuals to activities and/or appointments may also be your responsibility. Additional responsibilities may be specific to the individual's needs.

Foster Parent

Foster Parents are NOT employees; they are independent contractors and manage their own home business. Being a Foster Parent gives children and teenagers with unique challenges and needs an alternative to group homes or institutional placements. The concept is outcome oriented and focuses on building relationships in the community, the family, and one's personal life. Under Colorado state law, a foster provider is allowed to work with only one agency. Since our Foster Parents provide specialized care, we allow only two children/teenagers in the home, with the exception of some sibling groups. Foster Parents provide parental guidance to children and teenagers with developmental disabilities. Responsibilities may include teaching independent living skills to maintain a clean and safe living environment, meal preparation and self-administration of medication. Transporting individuals to activities and/or appointments may also be your responsibility. Additional responsibilities may be specific to the individual's needs.
